

Funding Opportunities for Displaced Scientists and Scholars at Risk

Academics in Solidarity is a peer-mentoring program offering counselling, access to trainings and the funding of small research endeavours. The program does not offer long-term fellowships, but rather additional funding for core research related activities, such as publications, conference attendance or writing grant proposals. Registrations can be submitted on a **rolling basis**.

DFG – Special Program for Ukraine offers support for Ukrainian researchers (project leaders) who are in Ukraine and are still able to pursue research. The option to apply is limited to DFG- Projects and a period of two years until further notice and applies to all proposals received on a rolling basis up to and including **15. September 2024**.

DFG-Walter Benjamin Programme of DFG enables researchers in the postdoctoral training phase to independently conduct their own research project at a location of their choice. Applications can be sent on a **rolling basis**.

Einstein Foundation offers visiting fellowships to at-risk scholars at Berlin-based academic institutions. Please note: Due to the Einstein Foundation's financial situation, no new applications for Einstein Centers can be accepted until 2024.

Philipp Schwartz-Initiative of the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation enables German universities and scientific institutions to provide at-risk researchers with a scholarship for two years. The next deadline for the 13th call of fellowships is **September 15th, 2023**.

Scholar Rescue Fund grants one-year scholarships for research stays of endangered scholars at universities and research institutions worldwide. The one-year-fellowships depend on the willingness of the host institution to carry half of the costs for the fellowship of the person concerned. Applications can be sent on a **rolling basis** and fellowships are awarded quarterly.
